* Your budget will be recalculated during July, and appear in the August billing.



Does your boat or icehouse have a CO detector?

If you sleep on the ice or water, you need a CO detector.

CO is the chemical formula—Carbon and Oxygen—for Carbon Monoxide. A furnace or generator gives off CO when it burns propane, natural gas, wood, or any other fuel at less than 100% efficiency. A crack in a vent pipe can leak CO into a boat cabin or an icehouse.

The most common symptoms are headache, dizziness, weakness, nausea, vomiting, chest pain and confusion—but the higher the concentration of CO in the bloodstream, the more symptoms change and increase danger:



Remember, exposure to CO can cause loss of consciousness and death. Additionally, people who are sleeping or who have been drinking alcohol can die from CO poisoning before ever having symptoms.

If CO poisoning is suspected, get your family outside and **call your local fire department** or consult a health care professional right away.

All homes in Wisconsin are required to have CO detectors.
